## Committee Reports

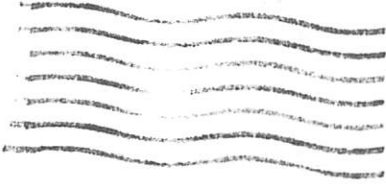

ERRY CREEK GUN CLUB Indoor range rules

1. Select a vacant shooting stand as close to shooting station one as is available.
2. Leave firearm cased as you set your case on the shooting stand. Keep the firearm pointed down range while opening the action to make the firearm obviously unloaded and safe and place it on the shooting stand with the muzzle pointed down range.
3. Firearms which can not be made obviously unloaded and safe to a casual visual inspection are not allowed on the range.
4. The firing line is safe only when ALL firearms are on the shooting stand with the muzzle pointed down range, action open, magazine removed, and firearm obviously unloaded.
5. Never handle any firearm when anyone is forward of the firing line.
6. Uncased firearms shall be pointed down range at all times.
7. The firing line shall be made unsafe (ready to resume firing) only when all shooters are behind the firing line and the shooters have been warned to put on their ear and eye protection.
8. When you wish to go forward of the firing line to change targets or police your brass, make your firearm safe and place it on the shooting stand. Then stand back from your shooting stand until all other shooters have indicated by like action that they wish to go forward also. Then ask if the line is safe and, if no negative response is heard, declare the line safe and go forward. Take care that shots
9. Take care that shots impact the backstop. When using the shooting stand as a shooting rest, lower your target to the same elevation as your firearm.
10. No quick draw, indiscriminate or random shooting is allowed. Shoot at paper targets only.
11. Magnums, high velocity, and/or heavily copper covered ammunition are not allowed on this range. No rifle calibers other than 22 rimfire are allowed; only mid-range target loads are acceptable.
12. No alcoholic beverages or horseplay is ever allowed in the firing range.
13. Promote courtesy. Keep silent while others are firing. Do NOT pickup your brass which is near another shooter's feet until he is through shooting. Keep your activities controlled so as not to distract other shooters. Pick up all brass in your shooting area but keep only what is yours. Voluntarily suspend your firing if all other shooters are waiting to go forward.
14. A club member is responsible for his actions and those of his guests. A member can have only one guest on the firing line at a time.
15. When you are through firing and before the line is made safe, make sure your firearm is unloaded and place it in its case. You and your cased firearm may then leave the firing line.
16. Leave the range as you found it. This means: police your brass; sweep the floor; turn off the carrier power switches, the heat, the fans, and the lights. Use your range key to engage the front door lock as you leave the building.
17. A member observing any violation of these rules shall attempt to correct the situation immediately on the range. If unsuccessful, an officer of the club should be called immediately. A list of phone numbers is posted on the bulletin board and by the telephone.
18. Report any range discrepancies and/or damage to a board member immediately so repairs may be made prior to the next scheduled range activity.
19. All range users must sign in and out.
