Dan continued to the 3 position event where he won the Junior Mens Title in 3 Position with an 1154 and an 1158.

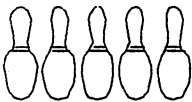
Dan went on to win the Junior Mens Air Rifle Title with a 583 and a 582. Dan also qualified for the final match in air rifle (top 8 shooters).

CHERRY CREEK GUN CLUB General Meeting Sept. 13th, 1996

7:30 PM at the club house.

1. The President Tom Thrush, called the meeting to order at 7:31 PM.
2. The minutes to the last general and board meetings were approved as published in the newsletter.
3. The treasurer, Ron Pieffer, reported a checking account balance of \$2,494.26 and a money market account balance of \$55,073.72. The only obligations due are the normal monthly bills.
4. The secretary reported receiving a letter from the NRA Foundation.
5. Vern Neidig said that the Winter Pistol league program flyer would be mailed in the next two weeks.
6. Clark Calve said that the development to the north and west of the range is a high density, high cost town home complex which will probably have a secured or guarded entry.
7. Warren Johnston has had the fire extinguishers tested and Clark Calve said that the wire penetration from the control booth to the timer shelf would be changed this week end.
8. Fred Crowle said that the Ed Harvey match had a low turn out but that those who attended had a good time.
9. Charles Peacock said that the Cunningham fire district called to schedule a follow up inspection of the facility. Peacock said that the Central Division Smallbore Winter league would start the last Wednesday of September in the east bay only.
10. Charles Peacock said that amendment 11 which would remove tax exempt status has received a lot of publicity.
11. Chuck Towne said that the pistol 2700 matches would start the last full weekend of September with relays scheduled on Saturday morning, Saturday afternoon, and Sunday morning depending upon participation.
12. Howard Glasier said that Aurora's voters will be asked whether to annex areas of Aurora into a county. If passed, the issue would come before state voters.
13. Howard Glasier said that the numbers who attend the tube indoctrination classes has fallen to near zero and that he would schedule the classes as the need arises.
14. Ben Zizzi said that he had only enough material for a two page newsletter this month which had been received by many members just prior to the meeting.
15. Howard Glasier asked whether a replacement for the treasurer had been found and suggested offering the payment of the dues to whoever would take the job. Ben Zizzi usually spends about 20 hours to put out each issue of the newsletter. Joe Marosy said that time and time again the issue of exchanging dues money for a job has come up and been defeated and that the suggestion should never considered again. A suggestion was made to authorize the expense of having the newsletter folded, stapled, etc. done to minimize Ben's time. Ben will check to determine the expense for this work.
16. Ted Zimmerman asked when the work on the street improvements would be done. This work should be done next summer and will cost the club an assessed amount for the 30 foot frontage of the new property but should receive about \$60 per foot for a five foot easement for the range property frontage.
17. The meeting was adjourned at 7:57 PM.

10. Charles Peacock said that his wife would accept the job of treasurer if no one else would take the job. Further discussion followed.
11. The meeting was adjourned at 8:03 PM.
