## **Monday Night Bullseye League**

Monday nights are reserved for Winter Pistol League, a.k.a. Bullseye League, a.k.a. 2700 Loge. Bullseye is a competitive event – though the league is much more informal – where the competitors try to hit the X in for 30 shots, one handed, from 25 yards. The first 10 shots are taken in 10 minutes (Slow Fire), then 2 strings of 5 shots, each in 20 seconds (Timed Fired), then

2 strings of 5 shots, each in 10 seconds (Rapid Fired). By the way, the Slow Fire target is only about a quarter the size of the other two. Bullseye teaches concentration, trigger control, breath control, sight alignment, and all the other skills that your Basic Pistol instructor said were part of good shooting.

The league is a great place to learn the sport in a friendly, fun atmosphere where the new shooter can get pointers and learn from the other shooters. Contact Steve Locatelli or just show up between the hours of 4:00 PM and 8:00 PM on a Monday night. (The league runs until 10:00 PM but get there earlier so you have time to shoot.) There is a fee to cover targets and end-of season prizes.

## **Firearms Lawsuit**

My name is John Sternberg and I am a member of this club. I have initiated a gun rights lawsuit against The City of Denver. The suit is over Denver's claim that their Municipal ordinances supersede state law. This suit has been supported by the NRA Civil Rights Defense Fund. Veteran gun rights attorney Stephen Halbrook is handling the appeal of this case to the Colorado Supreme Court.

There is a similar, but different case, titled Denver v. State of Colorado. That case has yet to be appealed. I have a much stronger case than this similar case because my attorney made Denver produce evidence that will be helpful in the appeals process. If Denver wins this case or if I can't raise enough money for the appeal, then ALL home rule cities will be allowed to pass and enforce their own gun laws that could affect "concealed carry" "assault weapons", "junk guns", "safe storage", "open carry of firearms", "magazine bans" and other ordinances. Historically, there are more than 80

home rule cities with more than 165 local gun laws in Colorado. You do not have to live in Denver for this case to affect your gun rights one way or the other.

While the NRA CRDF has supported this suit, more money is needed to pay for the appeal. I need to raise about \$25,000 for this appeal. 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### **CHERRY CREEK GUN CLUB General Meeting**

November 11, 2004, 7:30 PM at the club house

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Pres. Don Shearer.
2. The minutes were approved as published in the newsletter.
3. Board Reports:
  - (a) George Wright: Tube Qualification is next Friday at 18:30; participants need to bring ammo, targets, eye & ear protection, and their rifle. Sign up on the tube door and call George to confirm: no calls, no class.
  - (b) Clark Calvé: holding 2 cards for members needing to complete the safety course.
  - (c) Lee Ormiston: next Friday is Scout Marksmanship Merit Badge program.
  - (d) Lee Ormiston: elections are over; lame duck session is very important time as people in Senate & House who aren't going to have a job may vote for some "squirrely stuff."
  - (e) Dave Epps: renewals start next month. Remember that dues have gone up for 2005. One person per form, with funds! No form, no renewal, even if you include a check.
  - (f) Dave Epps: met with Doug Schneider; camera system has arrived and will be installed.
  - (g) Jim Bailey: 2 more work parties and slots for janitors (4) are available and good for work bond refunds: last chances for the year.
  - (h) Gary Trisdale: has some new Juniors, match tomorrow in Colorado Springs at the Olympic Center.
  - (i) Bill Collins: cleaned up mailing list and verified with member roster. Expect 447 mailings for December.
4. New Business:

- (a) Correspondence:
  - i. Message from the Family Shooting Center at Cherry Creek State Park; the facility is under new management. The notice will be on the bulletin board.
  - ii. Newsletter from Citizens Committee to Keep & Bear Arms, will be in the rack
  - iii. Received payment for 35,416 pounds of lead at \$.035/lb (total \$1239.65), money will go to the Juniors.
  - iv. Newsletter from the Colorado Wild Turkey Federation & Wheeling Sportsmen; includes an article about a blind new shooter and his partner (they are also CCGC members and CCGC is mentioned in the article).
  - v. Request from CSSA for CCGC match schedule and information.
- (b) Don Shearer received a certificate for liability insurance related to the previous contractor that cleaned lead from the tube.

5. Old Business:

- (a) Two volunteers for handling the newsletter in 2005 have been identified.
- (b) Curt Lackey reported that the heating system is 95% done, much is new or refurbished. Now finishing up with the fan switches and timers; all should be complete in about a week but even in the meantime, WE HAVE HEAT! West Range is near 100% working; East Range is having some trouble with hot surface igniter. Ralph Brown and Curt Lackey and Howard Glasier have put in significant hours on this project.
- (c) BOD Election Committee Report (George Wright): Election will be held December 10. Four current members not running. They have identified 17 candidates. On election night, there may be nominations from the floor although the person being nominated must be in attendance to accept the nomination. George read the list of candidates (David Stoner has withdrawn from the race; Warren Johnston has been joined the race).
- (d) Tom DeHerrera voiced concern over members who do not follow rifle tube, pistol range, and club rules concerning sighting in and allowed calibers, and causing damage to the facility. Dave Epps responded that enforcing the rules is the purpose of the camera system. Also, a new copy of the pistol range rules has been posted on the pistol ranges.

6. New Business:

- (a) Don Shearer read the applications from seven applicants. The applicants spoke of their experience shooting and their interest in the club; their sponsors spoke of their experience shooting with the applicants and the applicants' safety habits. A motion to accept the new members was made and passed. The new members are Walter Trogg, Nick Limke, Ashley Townsend, Aaron Harper, Okan Saribal, Justin Franz, Dale Mackintosh; the unsponsored members needing to complete the safety course with Clark Calvé are Trogg, Limke, Townsend, Harper, and Mackintosh.
- (b) Dates for Work Parties are November 20 and December 11. The notices posted at the club have been corrected.
- (c) The December Board Meeting will be Wednesday, December 29<sup>th</sup> rather than Friday, December 31<sup>st</sup>, in order to avoid the holiday.
- (d) Howard Glasier reported that position 20 controls have been set up for handicapped access. He has also found steel for position 10 but it is very expensive.

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## **CHERRY CREEK GUN CLUB Board of Directors Meeting**

October 29, 2004, 7:30 PM at the club house

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Pres. Don Shearer.
2. The minutes were approved as published in the newsletter.
3. Board Member Reports:
  - (a) Clark Calve has 2 Corby cards for new members needing to take the safety course.
  - (b) Dave Goodlette will miss the next member's meeting.
  - (c) Tom Thrush sent bylaw amendments and articles of incorporation to Bob Lees.
  - (d) Jim Bailey needs one more janitor for December. Also a reminder that the December work party will be on the 11<sup>th</sup>.
  - (e) George Wright reported that there have been at least 8 shots, in a straight line, at the 11:00 position in the tube; sometime between November 22<sup>nd</sup> and November 24<sup>th</sup>, near the 15-30 yard line from the target. There are also 5 hits on 2 light shields.
  - (f) Lee Ormiston reports that there were 2 scouts last session (the session prior to Thanksgiving). He would like to expand the program to include, for example, NRA medals in addition to their merit badges.
  - (g) Lee Ormiston reported that the city of Denver took parts of SB25 to court and the court ruled that Denver can ban certain firearms as assault weapons, can require "safe storage," firearm melting point restrictions, and other issues. We have heard that other organizations have requested that their members call the Governor's office (303.866.2471) to request that the State appeal the rulings. George Wright reported that an appeal is underway and it has been reported that Denver has agreed not to enforce some of the city laws pending the appeal. State-wide Concealed Carry remains in effect in Denver as part of the same judicial rulings.
  - (h) Gary Trisdale reported that the Juniors are doing well and completed a match.
  - (i) Dave Epps has completed the cabling for the camera system. George Wright will assist him in completing the installation of the electronics. There will be 3 cameras in each pistol range, 2 in the meeting room, and 1 in the tube.
4. Old Business:
  - (a) George Wright reported that ballots and all preparations are ready for the next Board of Directors election.
  - (b) Curt Lackey reported that the heating system repair is 98% complete. The fan will not come on until the heater is up to the necessary temperature. There is a balance to be attained between the volume of air flowing past the firing line and the amount of heat brought into the facility.
  - (c) Armor plate to convert position 10 to a magnum position is not available at the approved expenditure. We will not convert that position unless a better deal on armor plate can be

identified; Howard Glasier will continue shopping at the previously authorized level of \$750.

5. New Business:

- (a) Don Shearer introduced John Sternberg, a member who discussed a lawsuit he is involved in as plaintiff against the city of Denver. John requested a donation from the club or the opportunity to address the membership for donations. The Board discussed the requests after Mr. Sternberg's departure. A motion was made that the CCGC will make no donation to the action; the general membership may make donations in their own name if members so desire – the motion passed. A motion was made that a newsletter article as an “fyi to the membership” concerning Mr. Sternberg's appeal be published in the newsletter over the next four months – the motion passed.
- (b) Dave Goodlette reported that member Brad Lightner's son was severely injured in an auto accident with an elk. He is improving. We wish Brad and his son the best.
- (c) Don read a note from a member who stated that he shot out a fluorescent light between 50 and 75 feet, and offered to pay for it. The Board appreciates his honesty and reporting of the event. Remuneration will not be requested.
- (d) Dave Epps discussed the installation of the camera system and the policies surrounding their use. The original policies proposed in conjunction with the installation will be reviewed at the next Board meeting.
- (e) Tom noted that the parking lot gravel is showing bare spots and will need to be redistributed.

6. The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.
