SAN FRANCISCO BACKS OFF-- FOR NOW
(from NRA-ILA)

Bowing to pressure from NRA and law-abiding firearm owners, the City of San Francisco has agreed to postpone enforcement of the provision of Prop H that bans the sale or transfer of any firearm or ammunition until March 1, 2006. The handgun possession ban provision of Prop H does not go into effect until April 1, 2006. Residents of San Francisco have until then to get their guns out of the city or turn them in to police without compensation.

In the interim, the NRA lawsuit challenging the ordinance will be filed in the San Francisco Superior Court. NRA had previously filed suit in the Court of Appeals on November 9, but the Court declined to exercise jurisdiction until the Superior Court had heard the matter. The hearing date on NRA's motion to invalidate the entire ordinance has been tentatively scheduled for February 15, 2006, in San Francisco Superior Court.

STERNBERG VS. DENVER

John Sternberg has asserted that Denver must follow Colorado law with respect to uniform state standards for firearms. This is the first Court challenge to Denver. (The following update is from CSSA.)

Oral arguments before the Colorado Supreme Court in the Sternberg v Denver case were heard December 8th with nationally famous pro-second amendment attorney, Stephen Halbrook, representing John Sternberg.

Chief Justice Mullarkey and Justices Coates, Hobbs, Kourlis, and Rice all asked Denver tough and probing questions.

Justice Hobbs' questions included verifying that it would actually be a violation of Denver ordinance for him to give a hunting rifle to a minor son even if that son had completed Hunter Education. Stephen Halbrook did a great job answering questions and making it clear why Denver's ordinances deny basic constitutional rights and why we need uniform and predictable laws through out Colorado, including in Denver.

Colorado gun owners owe their thanks to attorneys Stephen Halbrook and Anne Gill for their able representation, to John Sternberg for having brought this suit, and to NRA Civil Rights Defense Fund for their help in funding this important litigation.

One of the Denver papers has stated that a decision from the Colorado Supreme Court is hoped for within a couple of months, but there is no way to know when it will be announced.

Juniors Off to a Good Start

In October and November, we attended 3 matches. Two of these were local matches and one was a national match. Eight of our juniors attended one or more of these matches. They were Dustin English, Megan English, Sarah Havens, Conlan McGough, Ryann McGough, Tim Sherry, Chiara Trisdale and Samantha Trisdale. In addition, two other junior members of Cherry Creek Gun Club also attended. They were Kayla Franz and Scott Franz.

The local match in November consisted of air rifle and smallbore. At it, men and women competed separately. In women's air rifle, first and second place went to members of the national team, Samantha was 3rd, Sarah was 4th, Kayla was 5th, Megan was 6th, Ryann was 7th and Chiara was 9th. Four of the girls shot Master level scores - Samantha (387), Sarah (385), Kayla (383) and Megan (381). In men's air rifle, Scott was 2nd and Tim was 5th. Scott shot a master level score of 573. In women's smallbore, Megan was 1st, Ryann was 2nd, Samantha was 3rd, Sarah was 5th and Chiara was 7th. Tim was the winner of the men's smallbore.

The local match in December had the same format as the one in November. In men's air rifle, Dustin, Conlan and Tim all took first place in their class. In men's smallbore, Tim was 1st in his class, while Conlan and Dustin were 2nd in their class. In women's air rifle, the top 5 spots went to our juniors. Samantha and Ryann were tied for 1st going into the final with excellent scores of 387. The final order was Samantha was 1st, Ryann was 2nd, Megan was 3rd, Sarah was 4th and Chiara was 5th. In women's smallbore, Ryann was 1st, Megan was 2nd, Samantha was 3rd, Sarah was 4th and Chiara was 5th.

The big air rifle match of the year is the 3 Times Air Match. This is attended by Members of the National Team, the Army Marksmanship Unit, several collegiate shooters (most of who are juniors) and other juniors. Around 40 women (25 juniors) and 50 men (27 juniors) shot the air rifle events at this match. As the name implies, this match consist of 3 air rifle matches shot on 3 consecutive days. All of the juniors did very well, but I will just hit the high points. Three of the girls shot Master level scores on at least 1 day - Samantha (383, 382, 386), Megan (381, 383) and Ryann (380). On the 2nd day, Megan finished 9th among the junior women. On the

3rd day, Samantha made the junior final and finished 7th among junior women. Scott had an excellent match and finished 5th, 9th and 7th among junior men.

Taylor Beard, a junior member of Cherry Creek Gun Club, qualified to shoot the Championships of the Americas in Puerto Rico. This is a major international match where the best shooters in North and South America compete. Taylor finished 4th in the women's 3-position smallbore. This is an excellent finish for her first international match.

The big match in January is the Colorado Junior Olympic Shooting Championships being held the weekend of January 7 and 8. This match puts the best juniors in the state shoulder-to-shoulder in several events. The winners of this match are invited to the National Junior Olympics at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. We wish all of our juniors good luck at this match.

Pistol Range Ventilation/Heating

Ventilation work has been completed. It is imperative that the Members not turn off these New Exhaust Fans while shooting. We now have excellent exhaust air movement throughout the range.

Dec 16: Curt Lackey contacted the supplier of the Heating units and received a quote of \$1886.30 for both units. This does not include vent stacks, and there may be some other miscellaneous parts to buy. We also discussed the future furnaces and Curt does not believe we will need to replace what we have, with this new system we may eliminate the use of the old furnaces altogether, and I agree.

Dec 19th: Renovation of the Ranges was started to enable the installation of the New Heating units. Rerouting of some electrical systems was necessary so please be patient as each individual range may be closed for one or more days as installation is taking place.

Dec 30th: The East Range is ready to accept the new heating system and the West Range is about 90% ready. The systems should be delivered the week of Jan 2nd and will be immediately installed. There will be a Timer Switch located in each range to operate these units.

Special Announcement from the Board

New Procedure for applying for membership

For all members with prospective members and visitors wishing to apply to join. A new process started in November at the Board meeting. Be sure to read this all the way through as it is very different from what we have been doing in the past.

All new prospective members are now required to go through a background check. This is being done by a private investigative service and is a separate entity of the Club. Their main duty is to run a background check to verify that applicants are legally able to purchase, possess and use a firearm.

Applications will now be turned in at the Board meeting the month before the applicants joining month.

Applications will no longer be accepted and voted on at the general meeting, any applications turned in at the general meeting will not be considered until the next month.

This means that the applicant will bring in the application, their funds and a copy of their drivers license to the December Board meeting.

The application will be accepted and processed and they will then join officially in December at the General Meeting if all is returned acceptable. If not their funds will be returned to them as quickly as possible.

This schedule is for the remaining of this year and the 2006 year.

The fees for Juniors will stay consistent through the year and are not prorated down as the Regular and associate fees are. Regular members will pay a work bond, associate members and juniors do not.

Please be sure to read the chart and understand when things are to happen so that this transition can run as smooth as possible.

ENTRIES: Individual preference of relay must be noted at time of reservation. Entries close at 10 PM, February 9, 2006. Team entries may be made on the day of the match.

FEES: Entry fees must accompany registration, Military organizations excepted. Entry fees will be returned if notice of cancellation is received prior to February 9, 2006. Make checks payable to "Cherry Creek Gun Club".

Package Fee: \$15.00 includes NRA registration fees

State Registration Fee: \$10.00 additional required of all non-

members of the State Association for temporary honorary membership.

Competitors from States with official reciprocal agreements and who are members of their State Association need not pay the non-residency fee.

Team Entry Fee: \$8.00 per team

ELIGIBILITY: Individual: Open to all members of the NRA. Registrants must also be individual members of the Colorado State Shooting Association. Non-Association members must pay the State Registration Fee.

Teams: Teams must represent clubs, State Associations, Military or police organizations affiliated with the NRA and the Colorado State Shooting Association. No "pick-up" teams will be allowed.

CATEGORIES: Individual: In Match 5 only, Civilian and Service categories will be established in any class in which there are a minimum of ten competitors in each category. The Service category will be regular active service members. Civilian, National Guard, Reserve and Police will compete in the Civilian category.

RULES: NRA rules will govern.

CHALLENGES: A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each challenge. See NRA rules for procedure. The plug type scoring gauge is restricted to use by the Official NRA Referee in determining questionable shot values.

CLASSIFICATION: Individual: The NRA classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will fire in the Master class. If there are eight or more unclassified competitors in Match 5, an unclassified class will be established and awarded. Also, if there are more than three ladies entered in Match 5, a high lady award will be made.

Team: The NRA team classification system will be used.

PROGRAMS: All matches - .22 caliber rim fire, 50 feet.

Match 1 - 20 shots slow fire

Match 2 - 30 shots gallery course (national match course)

Match 3 - 20 shots timed fire

Match 4 - 20 shots rapid fire

Match 5 - STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AGGREGATE, sum of matches 1 thru 4.
