MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Any damage noted by a member should be reported to a Club officer or be noted in the log book provided in the control room.

Bowling Pins Shooting at CCGC

The bowling pin match is run every Tuesday from 6:30p.m. – 9:30p.m. on the west range all year long. It is open to members and non-members.

You can use any pistol with open or dot sights. Cartridges used are 22 lr and all centerfire rounds except for magnums. Ammunition has to be lead, FMJ or plated. No H.P. or soft point bullets. No heavy loads as they damage the steel bowling pins.

There are two shooting sections, first everyone competes with their 22 lr pistols, and then everyone competes with their center fire pistols.

On the third Tuesday of each month, using only 22 lr pistols you shoot at real bowling pins. The pins are on an 8 foot rail approximately 25 ft away from the shooter. We use a double elimination scale, down to the last shooter. This means that if you loose your match you get one more shot in the loser's bracket. Everyone wins a small trophy pin and a cash prize.

For regular matches members pay \$3 a round or \$5 for two; non-members pay \$4 a round or \$6 for two.

All members are reminded that as of the first of the year ID cards are to be visibly displayed on their person.

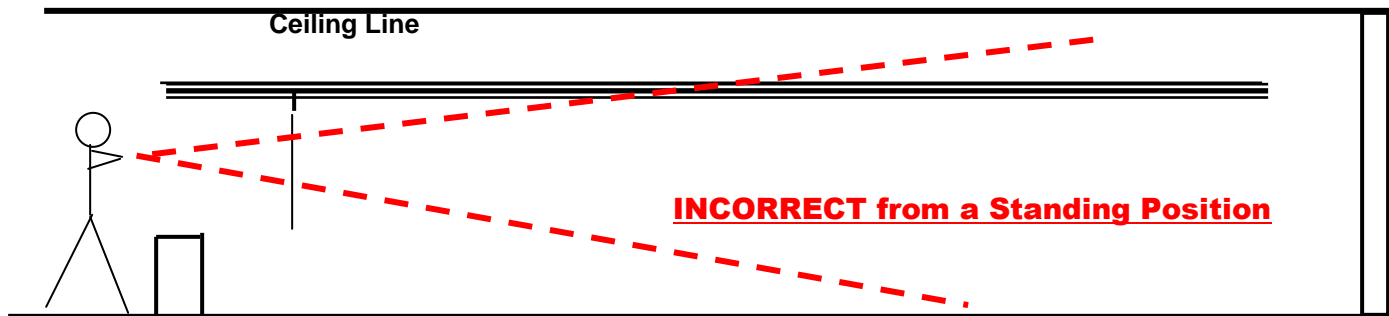
PISTOL RANGE RULES

- 1. EYE and EAR PROTECTION ARE MANDATORY.**
- 2. NO SHOTGUNS, SELECT-FIRE, or FULL-AUTO** Firearms allowed.
- 3. NO HOLSTER WORK** is allowed at any time.
- 4. TARGETS MUST BE POSITIONED** so as not to allow Rounds to Impact the Floor, Ceiling, or Target Carriers. SEE Diagram of Correct Target Placement.
- 5. BOTTLENECK** cartridges designed for pistol use; .357 Sig, .400 Cor-Bon, 9x25 Makarov, and others, must be fired on position 20 only, or the Rifle tube. **MAGNUM** calibers; .357, .44, .454 Casull, .480 Ruger, and like calibers, must be fired on position 20 only or the Rifle tube. **No shot shells allowed.**
- 6. When a Shooter goes Downrange: Guns must be made SAFE, on the BENCH, ACTIONS OPEN, MAG'S OUT/CYLINDERS EMPTY. Guns are not to be Handled when anyone is Down Range.**
- 7. When other Shooters are present on the Range:**
 - a) Before proceeding Downrange let other shooters know by calling out "RANGE CLEAR".**
 - b) When ready to Fire let other shooters know by calling out "HOT .RANGE".**
- 8. Only PAPER or CARDBOARD** targets are allowed. Exception for scheduled events.
- 9. Place "Dud" rounds in the Red bucket, one located in each range.**
- 10. Place all unwanted Brass in the Blue Barrel, one located in each range.**
- 11. CLEAN your Range after Shooting:** Police all Brass, Sweep and Dispose of all Target Chaff, used Targets should go in the trash barrels.
- 12. TURN OFF** all Lights, Heat/AC, when you leave.

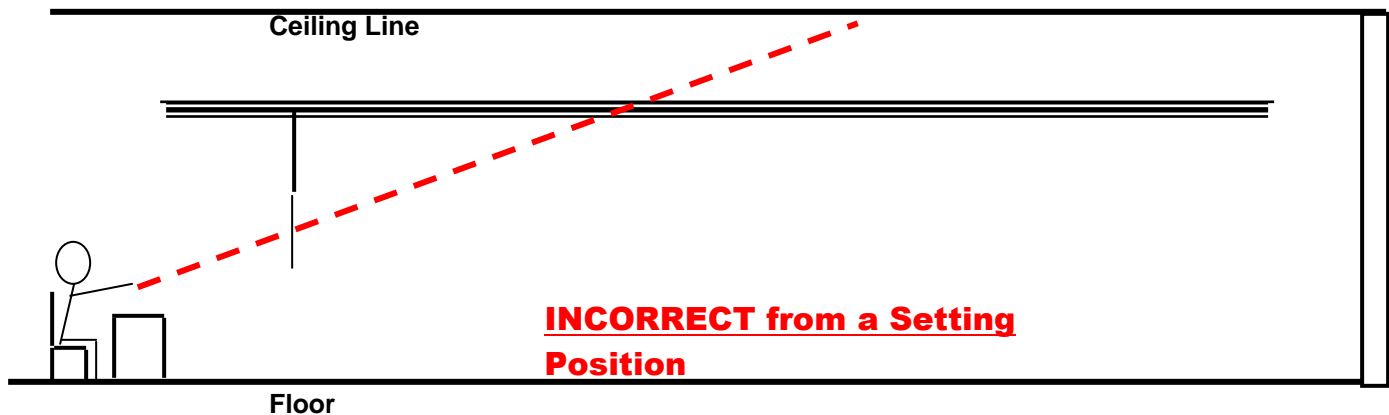
FOLLOW SAFE FIREARMS HANDLING PRACTICES AT ALL TIMES:

- 1. ALWAYS KEEP THE MUZZLE IN A SAFE DIRECTION**
- 2. ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL READY TO FIRE**
- 3. ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FIREARM UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE**
- 4. TREAT ALL FIREARMS AS IF THEY ARE LOADED**

Recently the range has sustained a lot of damage from errant rounds. This can be easily corrected if each person would correctly align their targets. The object is to keep the bullet parallel to the floor. Follow the diagrams below and insure that your target alignment is correct

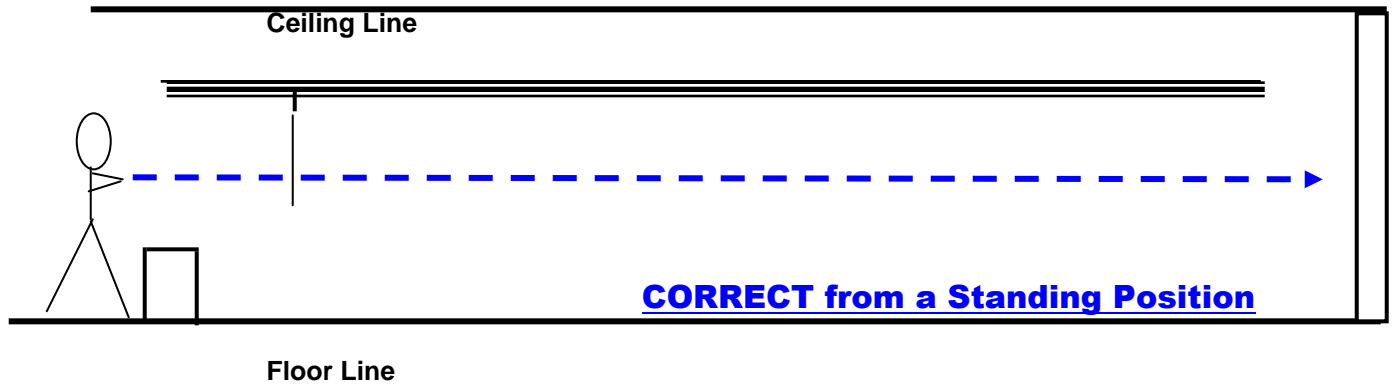


INCORRECT TARGET PLACEMENT

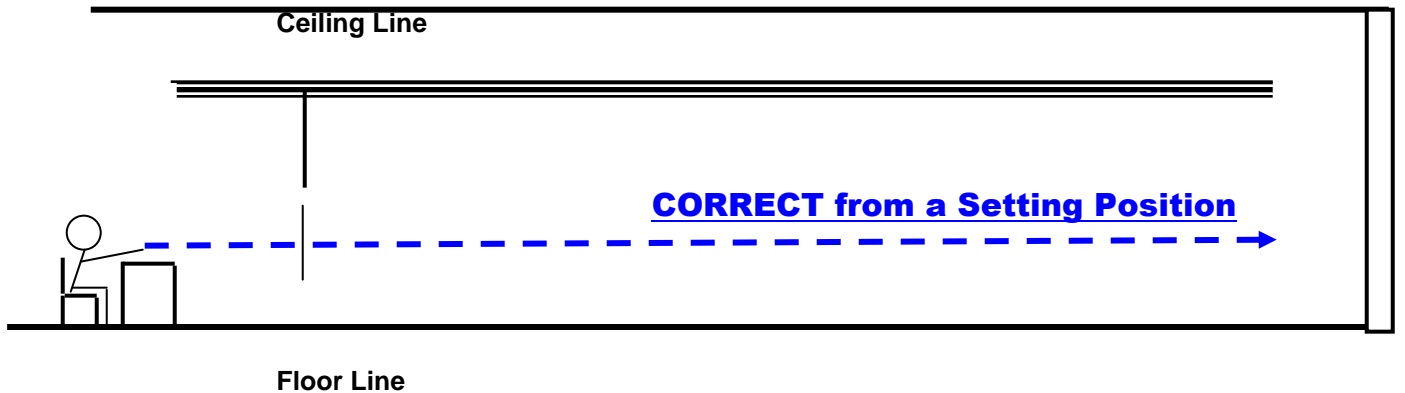


Incorrect Target Placement in relation to Distance to Target and the Position you are shooting from is **STILL** causing major Damage to the Floor, Ceiling, and Target Carriers.

Correct Target Placement can be easily determined: Sight on your Target, from a Standing or Setting Position, then slightly swing your Firearm Left and Right of your Target while looking down the sights, you will be able to see if your rounds are going to Impact the FLOOR, CEILING or BACKSTOP.

You may have to lengthen or shorten the target holder to obtain correct position

11. Jim Enos is getting familiar with the Video system and will help Stu Ritter.
12. Jim Bailey read the applications for membership. The applicants talked of their interest in the club, and their experience with firearms and the sport of hunting. The new members are: Michael Merkulovich, Clay Watson, Kenneth Anderson, Jay Hall, Adolf Hawkins, and a Junior Member Kathryn Bacon.
13. The applicants withdrew to the range so the members could vote on their membership.
14. The applicants were unanimously approved for membership.
15. The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 PM.

1. The meeting was called to order by Jim Bailey at 7 PM followed by the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
2. Bill Bierbach gave an update on George 'Doc' Henry who suffered injuries when he recently fell. He is in Kindred Hospital, 1920 High St. Denver, CO Room 507. The Club will get George a gift, and we all wish him a speedy full recovery.
3. Carlton Steubing asked about having additional certification classes taught this year, and perhaps having a class designed more specifically for women. The request was favorably received. Questions concerning insurance liability will have to be addressed.
4. Carlton also reminded the BOD that the Safety Course for new members must be taught by a certified instructor. Clark Calve was named primary Range Safety Officer with Carlton Steubing, Alan Montoya, Bill Bierbach, and Tom DeHerrera as alternates.
5. Key requests for any reason will go through Warren Johnston. Warren has a complete set of keys.
6. Eladio Faigal has requested an extension for renewing his membership. His mother passed away in England and he has been there taking care of family matters. An extension was granted.
7. Jack Priest asked if he should pursue the possibility of creating a more friendly website. He will continue to look into it. The website still contains some old information that should be removed to avoid possible confusion.
8. The Secretary brought up the cost of mailing the Newsletter to those members that do not have e-mail addresses. Some members indicated that other clubs do not mail their newsletters. Presently it costs the Club approximately \$100.00 each month to mail the newsletter to 68 members. No decision was made. Feedback from the members would be helpful.
9. Warren indicated that the work party repaired carriers cleaned up the range and cleaned up the property around the building. There was concern by some that the work parties need to be managed more efficiently. There are usually more members needed the first few months than the work planned, and too few later in the year. A change in policy is presented elsewhere in the newsletter.
10. Clark and Tom are working on modifications that should allow the Club to get final approvals for the HVAC system. It is not a quick fix and may take some time.
11. Tom Deherrera said the new thermostat is working. Day time temps will be 68⁰, night time temps will be 60⁰. Everyone is asked to leave the thermostat alone.
12. Jim Enos said he has some concerns about the security cameras and will perform a feasibility study to determine a cost effective way to improve the system.
13. Alan Montoya qualified 6 new members in the rifle tube.
14. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45PM.
